### **2. Real-life Experiences:**

Students, especially those struggling or quiet, tend to flourish when teachers genuinely believe in their abilities and offer encouragement.

### **3. Common Illusions:**

While teachers may express positive expectations to compensate for earlier negative ones, authentic belief has the most lasting impact.

### **4. The Self-Fulfilling Prophecy:**

When students are treated not just as they are, but as what they can become, they begin to internalise these roles and grow into them.

### **5. Benefits for teachers :**

- positive classroom culture
- Stronger relationships
- greater satisfaction when students thrive

To facilitate reflection and creativity, Director Ma'am divided the staff into groups:

Group 1: Preschool to Standard 2

Group 2: Standards 3 to 5

Group 3: Standards 6 to 8

Group 4: Standards 9 and 10

Group 5: Standards 11 and 12

Each group was given an anecdote related to the topic, and a representative from each group was invited to present a creative method or interpretation based on the scenario. The activity encouraged collaboration, thoughtful discussion, and innovative ideas for classroom practice.

The session was insightful and inspiring, reminding teachers of the profound impact that they can make in the classroom. With the right expectations and encouragement, educators can transform the learning journey of every student.


## **Match the Colour**



### Matchstick Maths - Roman Numerals




### Capping off the day in style!



### Blossoming with Vowels



### Mock Elections - A Learning Experience in democracy



### Integrated Chart Making & Flameless Cooking



# YOGANDHRA: YOGA FOR ONE EARTH, ONE HEALTH TIMPANY SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL








# BOOK READING ACTIVITY AT TIMPANY STEEL CITY SCHOOL

### “SMART SWAPS: CHOOSE RIGHT, LIVE BRIGHT”


To combat the rising health risks associated with excessive sugar consumption among school children, the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has mandated the establishment of ‘sugar boards’ in over 24,000 affiliated schools across India.


The initiative aims to educate students about healthy eating. The children have been asked to display information about "sugar boards", such as the recommended daily intake, the sugar content in commonly consumed foods like junk food and cold drinks, health risks associated with high sugar consumption, and healthier alternatives. With rising cases of Type 2 diabetes in children, it's crucial to educate the younger generation about making informed dietary choices.

The students from **Preschool to CLASS 4** were engaged in a **Family Activity**. All the family members together listed the sugary snacks, beverages and processed foods. They made sugar boards, and a family oath was taken to avoid all junk food. This activity aimed to help students understand the uses of sugar, its sources, and its role in our daily life, both the good and the not-so-good sides!

The students prepared colourful and informative Sugar Boards by collecting pictures, facts, and short notes. They learned how sugar is produced from sugarcane and sugar beet, and explored where sugar is used—in sweets, chocolates, and even in certain medicines. Some students even highlighted healthy alternatives and the importance of eating sugar in moderation. Through this hands-on project, the students not only improved their creativity and presentation skills but also gained awareness of how sugar affects our health.

## AI & ROBOTICS WORKSHOP

The Computer faculty of Timpany Schools attended a three-day online AI and Robotics training conducted by Yahweh Software Solutions on June 10, 11, and 12. The sessions were conducted by Mr. Bambino and Mr. Savvesh, with a focus on equipping teachers to effectively use the LMS and AI coding platform. The training was aligned with NEP 2020 and followed a project activity-based learning approach, incorporating the design thinking method. Teachers were given a detailed understanding of different approaches to learning, and the LMS platform was introduced through practical demonstrations, such as uploading activity videos and exploring various tools available for evaluating student performance.

The training provided valuable insights into effectively using the LMS for lesson planning, assessment, and enhancing student engagement. The session was also attended by Mrs. Vandana Abraham, Director and Principal of Timpany School.



## KIPS WORKSHOP

On June 28, 2025, the computer faculty of all three Timpany Schools participated in a KIPS workshop that began with a quick recap of the previous session, which was conducted on December 24. The session began with an introduction to basic Python concepts through a Scratch session, an online gamified coding platform. The facilitator, Mr. Mirnal J Hira, Product Manager at KIPS, highlighted the importance of coding from an early age using simple, GUI-based platforms.

Another interesting coding platform called EduBlocks was showcased, which is an easy-to-use tool for learning HTML, CSS, and Python without requiring prior coding experience. The discussion emphasised the growing importance of Artificial Intelligence in education, with practical demos of tools like ChatGPT and how AI is shaping the future of learning. The facilitator made the session interactive with a hands-on demo of the LMS platforms and encouraged questions throughout the session.
